Dear Parents/Carers,

In recognition of the hard work, commitment, and positive conduct demonstrated by our students this half-term, we are delighted to announce a non-uniform day for students who have received five or fewer behaviour points this half-term.

Students who meet this criterion were informed during Pastoral Curriculum Time today and have received a letter inviting them to participate in the non-uniform day on Friday 22nd May 2026. You can review your child's behaviour points for this half-term via the Arbor app.

However, we want to remind everyone that while this is a non-uniform day, the clothing chosen by students should still be appropriate for a school and working environment.

To ensure a safe and respectful atmosphere, please consider the following guidelines for attire on this day:

1. Clothing should be comfortable and suitable for a school setting.
2. It is important that all clothing choices are respectful, and garments do not include offensive language, symbols, or images. Please refrain from wearing items that promote violence or inappropriate themes.
3. Clothing should not be overly revealing – e.g. crop tops, sleeveless tops, body suits, and short shorts such as Nike Pros are not appropriate.
4. Footwear must cover the whole foot to ensure safety during school activities and movement around the building – flip flops / sliders/ crocs are not appropriate.
5. The regular school rules concerning piercings, jewellery, nails, and hair styles still apply.

We appreciate your support in ensuring that all students adhere to these expectations and approach this day with respect for themselves and for the wider school community.

Thank you for your cooperation, and we look forward to a fantastic non-uniform day as we celebrate the achievements of students who consistently demonstrate positive behaviour and make excellent choices throughout the school community.
