They got a real sense for what kind of school we are. The Lead Inspector was incredibly impressed with the responses from the student survey where 100% of responses agreed that we value students for who they are and that it is ok to be different. From all survey results they have seen from other schools they had never seen this! We are proud of our inclusivity.

As you know we are an incredibly busy school, especially our

reception team who are one of the busiest. We have found that since the removal of phones, we are being asked to pass on more messages to students. SEND Information for Parents

At Passmores we have a dedicated SEND team comprising of:

Dawn Moore – SENCO Carly Cleary – Assistant SENCO Emma Elven – SEND Lead

Sam Currie – SEND Lead Ria Newnham – SEND Lead Corrin Ward - SEND Lead

Debra Berkley - SEND Administration Assistant

Each member of staff has different skills and experience within specific areas of SEND.

If you have any queries or concerns, the first approach is to email <u>d.berkley@passmoresacademy.com</u> who will then be able to pass it on to the most relevant member of the team. We always aim to reply to all emails within 48 hours – more quickly if possible or when there is an urgent need.

Leads are not always in the office to pick up phone calls and unfortunately, we do not have capacity to answer phone calls between 8am and 9am as we are working with students who check-in with Leads and prepare them for the school day. Similarly, we run a SEND homework club after school and thus, can't pick up phone calls from parents wanting feedback about the school day. If you can't relay important information by email, please leave a message at reception and we will get back to you as soon as we can.

If you feel your young person is struggling and may need to be added to the SEND register, please put as much detail as possible in your email. This will then trigger an assessment phase which usually takes several weeks as we speak to all their teachers and conduct a wide range of tests. After this, one of the Leads will be in contact to discuss the outcomes.

Many parents contact us asking for one-to-one in-class support for their young person. This is something that many primary schools are able to offer, but that is no longer possible in a large mainstream secondary. We do not offer one-to-one support for any students as we believe that it hinders the development of independence and resilience – two vital skills for adulthood.

Students receive extra classroom support as and when the greatest needs arise. This is using a 'hover model' where a co-educator is in the classroom and responds to requests for help from any student or is directed by the teacher. Unfortunately, we do not have sufficient co-educators to support every lesson. We concentrate on core subjects and those with a high literacy demand.

Co-educators also support students' learning by delivering a wide range of evidence-based interventions such as literacy, numeracy, social skills and emotional regulation.

CAREERS NEWS

National Careers Week 4th - 8th March

National Careers Week aims to promote careers guidance in schools across the UK, raising awareness of different career paths and how these can be achieved, helping to raise aspirations and inspire young people to think about their future choices and opportunities.

To celebrate this at Passmores, we will be talking to students about careers in tutor time and will show videos of different career paths and give resources so that students can do further research themselves. We also have a representative from Taylor Wimpey Plc, which is one of the largest construction companies in the UK, coming in on Wednesday to deliver an assembly on the range of career paths within this organisation and Harlow College doing a 'pop up' drop-in session over lunch.

Careers education is an important part of our curriculum. Students have access to careers information through their I-Future lessons, assemblies, guest speakers and one to one careers guidance.

Work experience is a great way of finding out what it is like to go to work and try something out. All our year 10s have been given the opportunity to take part in a work shadowing day on the 2nd of May. They have until the 28th March to return their forms. Students can also access free online work experience from the age of 13-19 via <u>Virtual Work Experience Search (springpod.com)</u> Many of these programmes are on demand so can be accessed anytime throughout the year. Students receive a certificate of completion which is a great addition to any CV.

Springpod are also running free 60-minute courses, which will all be certificated, on apprenticeships, T Levels and Higher Technical Qualifications, which you can access on:


